# FRCC HISTORY

In the late 1950's, the three investor-owned utilities in peninsular Florida formed an informal association known as the "Florida Operating Committee." The purpose was to improve coordination and increase transmission interconnection capabilities to allow sharing of operating reserves to achieve economic benefits for customers.

It was formalized in 1972 as the Florida Electric Power Coordinating Group ("FCG") and was open to all Florida electric utilities. FCG conducted coordinated operating, planning and stability studies, and developed operating policies and procedures for reliability.


The Florida Reliability Coordinating Council (FRCC) emerged from FCG in the late 1990's and is a Florida 501(c)(6) Not-For-Profit Member Services organization.

# FRCC TODAY

**FRCC's Mission:** To coordinate a safe, reliable, and secure bulk power system with our Members.

- FRCC's Reliability Area is equal to the area of Florida served by the FRCC Voting Members.
- FRCC's Members include electric utilities who represent six sectors:
  - Non-Investor Owned Utility Wholesale Sector
  - Load Serving Entity Sector
  - Generating Load Serving Entity Sector
  - Investor Owned Utility Sector
  - Suppliers Sector
  - General Sector

# FRCC RELIABILITY AREA ELECTRIC GENERATION, TRANSMISSION & DISTRIBUTION





# FRCC'S ACTIVITIES: AN OVERVIEW

- Activities are identified and driven by Members and implemented by the FRCC Operating and Planning Committees.
- FRCC's activities are overseen by a Board of Directors comprised of Directors elected from each of the represented sectors. Each serves a two-year term.
- Activities include:
  - Overseeing the Reliability Coordinator (RC) function (NERC registration)
  - Overseeing the Planning Authority (PA) function (NERC registration)
  - Implementing the *FRCC Reliability Coordinator Reliability Plan*
  - Performing State Capacity Emergency Coordinator (SCEC) functions
  - Implementing the *FRCC Regional Transmission Planning Process*
  - Fulfilling commitments to the Florida Public Service Commission (FPSC)

# FRCC FUNDING

- FRCC's Board of Directors approve FRCC's Business Plan and Budget annually.
- FRCC is funded by its Members in proportion to the individual Member's Allocation, which is calculated using a formula that considers the Member's Load, Generating Capacity, and Miles of Transmission.

# FRCC DOES NOT . . .

## FRCC does not:

- Own, operate, or have any enforcement authority over any electric generation facilities, or electric transmission or distribution lines or substations.
- Sell or send bills for retail electricity to residences or businesses.
- Control or operate electric service to local areas, neighborhoods, or individual premises.
- Establish pricing or rates for retail electric customers.
- Have any direct customer relationships with the public.
